














Results

What Worked

- Initial Triage Performed Separately And Then Bringing Consultants Back Together To Compare Notes
- Different Specialties Of Consultants But With Common Working Background
- Frequent Meetings To Exchange Thoughts

What Did Not Work

- Initial Selection Of Patents Could Be Improved To Increase Chance Of Success
- Need To Identify Or Enhance Software To Allow IP To Be Captured Easier And Allow For Sharing Between Consultants


Next Steps

- Consider Utilizing Proposed Search Methodology To Look At Additional Patents Utilizing The Developed Process
- 500 Additional Patents From The Midwest FLC That Fit The Proposed Search Methodology
 - Third Party Vendor To Use The New Method
 - Review Complete 3 Weeks Post Receipt Of Patent List From Third Party
