The Manufacturing Extension Partnership program (480) has a detail opportunity for an ES-340 Deputy Director position. This is a great developmental opportunity for anyone who wants to gain senior executive experience in industry extension.

Length of Detail

120 days with the option to extend for an additional 120 days not-to-exceed 240 days total. The detail is expected to start in January 2021.

Who May Apply

Interested current Federal employees who meet the below qualifications:

*If selected, this will not be processed as a temporary promotion, it will be processed as a detail, without a pay increase.

Duties

The applicant selected for this detail will serve as the Deputy Director for the Manufacturing Extension Partnership Operating Unit. The position will encompass executive leadership of critical programmatic needs, including:

- Participation in determinations of major MEP/NIST policy issues;
- Fiscal agreements for modernizing America's manufacturing base;
- Direction of program analyses and evaluations for determination of national needs;
- Assessment of future manufacturing needs, current priorities, and technical opportunities;
- Collaboration with OU Directors and Deputies on NIST planning and review; and
- Design, implementation, and management of programs to enhance U.S. competitiveness through provision of traditional NIST services.

Qualifications

To qualify for the detail, you must meet the following requirements:

1. A broad knowledge of manufacturing and industrial extension technology-based economic development, and entrepreneurship practices as evidenced by technical or business experience, publications, and/or presentations and demonstrated experience working with Congressional members and staff, state elected officials and policy makers.
2. Demonstrated experience planning, organizing and managing programs in manufacturing, technology translation, deployment, dissemination and integration or industrial extension that involves both Federal and non-Federal partners using financial and non-financial assistance to respond to national needs and in direct support of US-based manufacturing.
3. Demonstrated experience providing authoritative direction and management of a multi-level technical and business organization of significant size, resource, complexity, and scope.
